Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) (NOFO is currently open)	Department of Transportation	Grants for surface transportation infrastructure projects to improve: safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, mobility and community connectivity, and economic competitiveness.
Charging and Fueling Infrastructure	Department of Transportation	Grants to install electric vehicle charging and alternative fuel in locations on public roads, schools, parks, and parking facilities.
Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT)	Department of Transportation	Supports planning, resilience improvements, community resilience and evacuation routes, and at-risk coastal infrastructure.
Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program (Formula funding)	Department of Energy	Supports States, local governments, and Tribes in implementing strategies to reduce energy use, reduce fossil fuel emissions, and improve energy efficiency.

Safe Streets for All (SS4A)	Department of Transportation	Grants for regional, local, and Tribal initiatives to prevent roadway deaths and injuries.
Reconnecting Communities Program and Neighborhood	Department of Transportation	Federal program dedicated to reconnecting communities that were previously cut off from

Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Opportunities (Mega , INFRA , and Rural)	Department of Transportation	<p>The Mega Program will support large, complex projects likely to generate national or regional economic, mobility, or safety benefits.</p> <p>INFRA awards grants for multimodal freight and highway projects of national or regional significance.</p> <p>The Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program will support projects to improve and expand the surface transportation infrastructure in rural areas.</p>
Digital Equity Competitive Grants	Department of Commerce	Grants to promote digital equity and inclusion to ensure that all communities are able to leverage the benefits of the digital economy.
Thriving Communities	Department of Transportation	Grants that provide hands-on planning support and technical assistance to advanced infrastructure projects that address critical social, economic, environmental, and mobility needs.

Rail Vehicle Replacement Program	Department of Transportation	Funding to transit agencies that operate fixed-guideway and high-intensity motorbus systems for the maintenance, replacement, and rehabilitation of capital assets.
Bridge Investment Program	Department of Transportation	Grant to reduce the overall number of bridges in fair or poor condition.
Railroad Crossing Elimination Program	Department of Transportation	Funding for highway-rail or pathway-rail grade crossing improvement projects that focus on improving the safety and mobility of people and goods.
Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program	Department of Transportation	Grants for active transportation networks that connect people with public transportation, businesses, workplaces, schools, residences,



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		recreation areas, and other community activity centers.
Brownfield Grants (Some NOFOs are currently open for FY23; FY24 is expected for this quarter)	Environmental Protection Agency	The EPA Brownfields program provides several types of grants as well as technical assistance to communities, states, tribes and others to assess, safely clean up and sustainably reuse contaminated properties.
Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) and Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Programs	Federal Emergency Management Administration	Support to undertake hazard mitigation projects, reducing the risks faced from disasters and natural hazards.
State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program	Federal Emergency Management Administration	Grants to address cybersecurity risks and cybersecurity threats to information systems owned or operated by, or on behalf of, state, local, or tribal governments.
Quarter 4 (October-December 2023)		
Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) Program	Department of Transportation	Funding for projects that improve the safety, efficiency, and reliability of intercity passenger and freight rail.
Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants Program	Department of Transportation	Grants to conduct demonstration projects focused on advanced smart community technologies and systems in order to improve transportation efficiency and safety.
National Culvert Removal, Replacement, and Restoration Grants	Department of Transportation	Grants for the replacement, removal, and repair of culverts or weirs that meaningfully improve or restore fish passage for anadromous fish. Anadromous fish species are born in freshwater such as streams and rivers, spend most of their lives in the marine environment, and migrate back to freshwater to spawn.

<p>Recycling Education and Outreach Grant Program and Solid Waste Infrastructure For Recycling (SWIFR) Grant Program for Political Subdivisions of States and Territories</p> <p>(NOFO is currently open)</p>	<p>Environmental Protection Agency</p>	<p>Grants to implement the National Recycling Strategy to improve post-consumer materials management and infrastructure; support improvements to local post-consumer materials management and recycling programs; and assist local waste management authorities in making improvements to local waste management systems.</p>
<p>Resilient and Efficient Codes Implementation</p> <p>(NOFO is currently open)</p>	<p>Department of Energy</p>	<p>Grants to enable sustained cost-effective implementation of updated building energy codes.</p>
<p>Energy Improvements at Public K-12 School Facilities</p>	<p>Department of Energy</p>	<p>Investments to make clean energy improvements at K-12 public schools. Funds will position school districts to make upgrades that will lower facilities' energy costs and foster healthier learning environments for students.</p>
<p>Clean Water (State Revolving Funds)</p>	<p>Environmental Protection Agency</p>	<p>States initially receive funding, then provide funds to Water Utilities and/or Municipal and Other Eligible Entities. Tribes and Territories are also eligible to receive a portion of State Revolving Fund funds.</p>
