



Opportunities for Local Governments to Plant Trees and Enhance Green Spaces

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) provide unprecedented support for tree planting, reforestation and green space enhancement, with a focus on promoting equity among communities disproportionately impacted by climate change through the Administration's Justice40 initiative.
