## Key 2023 NOFOs from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law consists of nearly 400 funding opportunities. At [localinfrastructure.org](https://localinfrastructure.org) you can find up-to-the moment information about how to apply for these programs to enable your city to win funding and drive positive outcomes for your residents. Below are key 2023 Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs), listed in order of when the NOFO is likely to be open (though the window between the NOFO opening and application due date is often uncertain and may in reality span two quarters). Please note that this list is not exhaustive, and the dates are subject to change.

<a href="#">Bridge Investment Program</a> <b>(NOFO closes 11/27/23)</b>	Department of Transportation	Grant to reduce the overall number of bridges in fair or poor condition.
<a href="#">Thriving Communities</a> <b>(NOFO closes 11/28/23)</b>	Department of Transportation	Grants that provide hands-on planning support and technical assistance to advanced infrastructure projects that address critical social, economic, environmental, and mobility needs.
<a href="#">Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) and Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Programs</a> <b>(NOFO closes 2/29/24)</b>	Federal Emergency Management Administration	Support to undertake hazard mitigation projects, reducing the risks faced from disasters and natural hazards.
<a href="#">Climate Pollution Reduction Grants: Implementation</a> <b>(NOFO closes 4/1/24)</b>	Environmental Protection Agency	Funding to implement GHG reduction policies, projects, and procedures

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<a href="#">Railroad Crossing Elimination Program</a>	Department of Transportation	Funding for highway-rail or pathway-rail grade crossing improvement projects that focus on improving the safety and mobility of people and goods.
<a href="#">Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) and Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Programs</a>	Federal Emergency Management Administration	Support to undertake hazard mitigation projects, reducing the risks faced from disasters and natural hazards.
<a href="#">Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) Program</a>	Department of Transportation	Funding for projects that improve the safety, efficiency, and reliability of intercity passenger and freight rail.
<a href="#">RAISE (2024)</a>	Department of Transportation	Grants for surface transportation infrastructure projects to improve: safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, mobility and community connectivity, and economic competitiveness.
<a href="#">Digital Equity Competitive Grants</a>	Department of Commerce	Grants to promote digital equity and inclusion to ensure that all communities are able to leverage the benefits of the digital economy. (Public comment on this new program is <a href="#">open through 5/1/23</a> —NOFO release date is TBD after this date)
<a href="#">National Culvert Removal, Replacement, and Restoration Grants</a>	Department of Transportation	For replacement, removal, and repair of culverts / weirs that meaningfully improve or restore passage for anadromous fish. Anadromous fish species are born in freshwater such as streams and rivers, spend most of their lives in the marine environment, and migrate back to freshwater to spawn.
<a href="#">Recycling Education and Outreach Grant Program and Solid Waste Infrastructure For Recycling (SWIFR) Grant Program for Political</a>	Environmental Protection Agency	Grants to <a href="#">implement the National Recycling Strategy</a> to improve post-consumer materials management and infrastructure; support improvements to local post-consumer materials management and recycling programs; and assist local waste management authorities in making improvements to local waste management systems.

<a href="#">Energy Improvements at Public K-12 School Facilities</a>	Department of Energy	Investments to make clean energy improvements at K-12 public schools. Funds will position school districts to make upgrades that will lower facilities' energy costs and foster healthier learning environments for students.
<a href="#">Clean and Drinking Water - State Revolving Funds</a> ( <i>application timelines vary by state</i> )	Environmental Protection Agency	States initially receive funding, then provide funds to Water Utilities and/or Municipal and Other Eligible Entities. Tribes and Territories are also eligible to receive a portion of State Revolving Fund funds.
<b>Quarter 1 (January-March 2024)</b>		
<a href="#">Low or No Emission Vehicle Program</a>	Department of Transportation	Grants for state and local governments to purchase or lease zero-emission and low-emission transit buses.
<a href="#">Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicle Program</a>	Environmental Protection Agency	Grants to replace heavy-duty vehicles with zero-emission vehicles.

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
