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Application

- Narrative
 - Templated project summary(ies)
 - Phasing
 - Planning, design, demolition, construction, etc.
- Budget
 - Increased costs
 - Value engineering
 - Prioritization
 - Request for Information (RFI)
- Non-awarded
 - Review provided funder feedback
 - Start a new draft application









Engage the funder

• Relationship management

Review awardees and their projects/applications

Engage them

Schedule follow-up meetings

- Funder
- Internal team
- External stakeholders













The Shift

- Increasingly view grants as investments not transfers and expect a measurable return to taxpayers
- Outputs delivered, outcomes achieved are not enough

"For every dollar spent, what lasting value was created for the public?"







Define ROL...in Public Sector Terms

- Move beyond "number served" or "projects completed" to capture:
 - o **Efficiency gains** (e.g., cost savings, time saved, or reduced duplication)
 - Economic multipliers (e.g., jobs created or private capital leveraged)
 - Long-term benefits (e.g., reduced future costs or improved resilience)
 - Public trust and transparency (e.g., better accountability or civic engagement)







Build ROI Measurement(s) Into the Project and Grant Designs

- At the application development stage, include ROI indicators linked to both outputs/outcomes and cost baselines.
 - \$1 invested in broadband access produces \$3 in annual community savings
 - Administrative process time reduced from 90 to
 30 days = \$X productivity gain

Use **cost-benefit**, **cost-effectiveness**, or **value-for-money** frameworks as standard practice







Equip Teams with Data Tools and Partnerships

- Collaborate with economic development team, data analysts, and academic partners to design ROI models
- Integrate financial, programmatic, and demographic data to quantify impacts over time
- Leverage dashboards to visualize ROI for decision-makers and the public







Reframe Reporting and Communication

- Move from compliance reports to investment reports that speak in returns, not just activities
- Translate outputs and outcomes into plain-language metrics:
 - For every \$1 in ARPA funds, we reduced community flood losses by \$5
 - Each training participant adds \$10,000 in local economic value







Connect ROI to Sustainability

- ROI isn't just what you achieved it's what continues after federal funding ends
- Highlight projects that build capacity, efficiency, and/or savings that sustain themselves post-grant
- Funders now view sustainability as part of ROI ongoing value beyond the grant period
